#### BE INFORMED. GET SUPPORT. BE EMPOWERED.

About 1 in 3 people with epilepsy who take antiepileptic medication(s) still get seizures. Others get unwanted side effects. New medications to control seizures are needed. But this can happen only through clinical trials and the participation of people like yourself.

If you have uncontrolled partial-onset seizures, consider joining a clinical research study. This clinical study will determine if an investigational treatment works when it is added to your existing antiepileptic medication(s).

#### You may qualify if you:

- Are 16 years of age or over
- Were diagnosed with epilepsy at least 12 months ago
- Are currently taking one or two antiepileptic medications
- Have had at least 4 partial-onset seizures in the past 4 weeks
- Are willing to document your seizures on a daily basis
- Can provide documentation of your epilepsy diagnosis

#### If you qualify:

##### You will receive at no cost to you:

- Care from a team of medical specialists
- Study-related exams and tests, with monitoring of seizures and overall health status
- Investigational study medication or a placebo (an inactive substance)
- Compensation for time and travel to and from study visits may be provided

There is no penalty if the clinical trial doctor is outside your insurer's network.
